### <sup>1</sup>Gender Data Collection and Documentation Guidance for Clinicians

Data collection and reporting of sex and gender is crucial for assessment of population health and determination of priority populations. Accurate information regarding sex and gender can be helpful for identifying differences in health outcomes, conditions that impact health, delivery of health services and prevention activities.

### Transgender (Trans):

A person whose gender identity differs from the sex that was assigned at birth.

A **trans man** (or trans male) is someone with a male gender identity who was assigned female sex at birth A **trans woman** (or trans female) is someone with a female gender identity who was assigned male sex at birth.

### Genderqueer or Gender Non-binary -

A person who does not subscribe to conventional gender distinctions; may feel their gender as neither, both, or some fluctuating combination of male/masculine and female/feminine genders.

<sup>2</sup>Lymphogranuloma Venereum (LGV) is a sexually transmitted disease caused by specific strains of chlamydia. It most commonly presents as proctitis in men who have sex with men. Report suspected or confirmed cases of LGV using the CMR.
